Independent Statement

After three lopsided victories over NCAA Division III foes, Azusa Pacific made a very strong case for itself as the NAIA's top independent program with a resounding 52-23 thumping of fellow independent Webber International last week. Three of the final five games are also against NAIA foes, starting with tonight's matchup against KCAC member McPherson, which was ranked 12th in the NAIA Preseason Coaches Poll. After road games at NCAA Div. II Dixie State (Utah) and Lindenwood (Mo.), Azusa Pacific hosts Southern Oregon in the Oct. 29 homecoming game for a school-record seventh regular-season home game. The regular season concludes with a road trip to Menlo College, a fellow NAIA independent with a 4-1 record this year in Atherton, Calif.

Air Raid

Azusa Pacific ranks second in the NAIA in rushing offense, but the Cougars' passing attack has gotten deadlier with each passing week. Since completing 8-of-29 for 128 yards in a season-opening defeat to San Diego, senior QB **John van den Raadt** has completed 62 percent (46-of-74) of his passes over the past four contests, throwing for 703 yards and seven touchdowns during the four-game stretch. The Cougars have had a different receiving yardage leader in each of the past three games. Senior WR **Matt Davis** had five catches for 86 yards in a 51-3 win over Whittier three weeks ago, and senior TE **Tyson Hetzer** was a bigplay threat in the 43-7 victory over Chapman Sept. 24, hauling in a 53-yard TD pass en route to 108 yards receiving on four catches. Last week, it was senior WR **Jeremiah Andujo** who caught eight passes for a team-high 129 yards in a 52-23 win over Webber International.

Leading The Way

Azusa Pacific ranks among the NAIA's top ten in numerous categories, including second in rushing offense (324.6 yards/game) and third in total offense (519.8 yards/game) and scoring offense (50.2 points/game). The Cougars also rank 14th in scoring defense, surrendering only 16 points per game despite allowing 42 points to San Diego in the season opener. Opponents are averaging just over 300 yards per game of total offense (301.8), including just 93 rushing yards per game.

The Total Package

Senior QB **John van den Raadt** has shared the spotlight with a stable of productive running backs for the NAIA's No. 2 rushing offense this season, but the dual-threat signal-caller became Azusa Pacific's all-time leader in total offense when he rushed for 139 yards and threw for 108 more on eight-of-12 passing in the Cougars' 51-3 win over Whittier Sept. 17. Van den Raadt broke the previous record of 6,707 held by Luke Winslow (1999-02), and his current mark for total offense stands at 7,525 (5,595 passing; 1,930 rushing).

Around The NAIA



The Azusa Pacific Cougars have moved up the poll for three consecutive weeks, albeit it one spot at a time. The team opened the season with a No. 15 national ranking, and remained there after the week one loss to the University of San Diego. But after four straight blowouts the Cougars find themselves at No. 12 with a 4-1 record.

In other NAIA news, the battle of the Saints between No. 1 St. Xavier (Ill.) and No. 2 St. Francis (Ind.) ended with a 42-31 win for Xavier. With the victory St. Xavier grabbed all 15 first place votes to remain atop the NAIA ratings for the fourth week in a row. The Cougars (St.

Xavier) are one of 10 unbeaten teams in the NAIA rankings. The new No. 2, Marian (Ind.), notched it's sixth straight W; beating Walsh (Ohio) 20-13. Carroll (Mont.) is the highest rated one-loss team in the country, sitting at No. 3 in the poll. The Saints drummed Montana State Northern (previously No. 22) 37-21 to record its third straight win after dropping 33-41 decision to Eastern Oregon. William Penn (Iowa) and Missouri Valley round out the top-5.

Whittany Radcliffe leads the team in kills (256; .279) with sophomore Jackie Landers trailing at 210 (.246). 2010 All-GSAC middle blocker (and NAIA third-team all-American) Amy Alkazin tops the team with a .342 attack percentage (187 kills) and 61 blocks.

The Cougars survived the brunt of their schedule, posting wins over ranked opponents Point Loma Nazarene, Biola, and Emporia State.

After tonight's game against The Master's **Chris Keife's** team will face in Santa Barbara on Tuesday night before a Saturday night matchup vs. Concordia at home a week from today.

At 5-2 in conference play Azusa Pacific currently sits in their place in the GSAC standings; trailing Concordia (6-1) and Fresno Pacific (7-0).

Two At A Time

McPherson's 2011 season might best be described by the expression "two steps forward and two steps back." After opening the year ranked 12th in the NAIA Preseason Coaches Poll, the Bulldogs dropped their first two games of the season to teams currently ranked in the top 15. Just when it seemed they were back on track with back-to-back conference wins over Southwestern (Kan.) and Friends (Kan.), McPherson suffered a shocking 42-35 loss at home to Bethel (Kan.), a program that was winless in 2010 and had lost four straight to start the 2011 campaign. Now, the Bulldogs sit in fifth place in the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference (KCAC) with a 2-2 league record, and a return trip to the NAIA playoffs seems very much in doubt unless McPherson can put their season back together in the next two weeks against ranked opponents Azusa Pacific (No. 12) and Ottawa (No. 19).

Not In Kansas Anymore

Last week's loss at home was a rare occurrence in McPherson's recent history, marking just the third defeat for the Bulldogs at home over the past three seasons. Through the end of the regular season last year, McPherson had won 11 straight home games. However, the Bulldogs have since lost three in a row at home, starting with last year's 38-14 NAIA first-round playoff loss to McKendree and continuing with two KCAC defeats against Bethany and Bethel this year. McPherson went 9-1 in regular-season road games in the 2009-10 seasons, the lone defeat coming in overtime at Ottawa, but this year's season-opening 47-10 defeat at Missouri Valley snapped the Bulldogs' eight-game regular-season road winning streak. In those 10 regular-season road games in 2009-10, McPherson averaged 48 points per game, but the Bulldogs are averaging only 18 points in three road contests so far this season.

Jones Sets The Tone

Senior RB **Travon Jones** is McPherson's leading rusher, carrying 90 times for 508 yards. His rushing total ranks eighth in the NAIA, and his per-game average of 101.6 yards is ninth nationally. He is also among the NAIA's national scoring leaders, ranking third in total scoring with nine all-purpose touchdowns (eight rushing), and his two-touchdown performance in last week's loss to Bethel was his third multiple-score game of the season. Jones set a career-high with four touchdowns in a 15-carry, 169-yard performance in the Bulldogs' 43-34 loss to Bethany earlier this year.

Program History

McPherson's all-time football record is 296-482-24, but the Bulldogs posted a perfect 10-0 regular season in 2010 to claim its third KCAC championship all-time, its first since 1952. Both of McPherson's NAIA playoff appearances have come in the past two seasons.
